

Holley Tankersley
Dean, Spadoni College of Education and Social Sciences
Professor of Political Science
Coastal Carolina University

Holley Tankersley, a political scientist with research and teaching expertise in public policy and political institutions, is Founding Dean of the Spadoni College of Education and Social Sciences at Coastal Carolina University. In this role, Tankersley is responsible for the leadership and management of a dynamic, student-centered college whose mission is rooted in community-engaged teaching, scholarship, and service. Prior her deanship, Tankersley served as Associate Provost of Strategic Initiatives and Faculty Development at Coastal Carolina University. She was responsible for the development and execution of strategic initiatives for academic innovation and excellence to enhance the University's mission; the creation and nourishment of programs that connect the University with local, state, and regional communities and partners; and the development and advocacy of policies and programs to ensure that faculty were successful in their teaching, scholarly, and leadership endeavors. During her four-year tenure as Chair of the Department of Political Science, Tankersley promoted and managed growth of the department as it doubled in size; argued for resources that nearly doubled the departmental budget; led faculty in deepening and expanding their commitment to high-impact learning practices; and founded the Edgar Dyer Institute for Leadership and Public Policy, an endowed teaching and research center focused on solving the policy problems of the community and the region. In 2017, Tankersley developed a structured dialogue program that unites students from diverse backgrounds to discuss how their experiences can create a strong, interconnected, and inspired campus community.

Before entering academia, Tankersley served as a government consultant, generating policy analysis for the Department of Housing and Urban Development and the Department of Health and Human Services. A native of Alabama, Tankersley earned her master's degree in public policy from Georgetown University and her Ph.D. in political science from the University of Georgia. She graduated Phi Beta Kappa with a bachelor's degree in political science from Birmingham-Southern College.

Instructions for EERA Conference Session Chairs

To those who have graciously agreed to serve as a Session Chair this year-THANK YOU! You play an important role in the conference, and in many situations, are helping a new generation of faculty members come to understand and appreciate how academic exchanges occur.

Your primary activity as a Session Chair is to introduce the session and the presenters, and to monitor the time allocated for each presenter. To do this, you will need to determine how many presentations there are in your session (typically 3-4, but in some cases five), and you will need to moderate the time each presenter is allocated. You are also responsible for keeping track of time and conveying this to the presenters. You should also save time at the end of your session to allow for a discussion among audience members and fellow presenters.

Please plan on arriving to the session you are chairing at least five minutes before the session begins, and please convey to the presenters the order in which they will be speaking (which, unless an issue arises, should be the order listed in the program). Remember, for some new faculty members or graduate students, this may be their first presentation and they might be quite nervous.

In some rare circumstances, there may be a limited audience attending the session you are chairing. Please work with the presenters to be reasonable about this. Some session chairs in past years have pulled chairs into a circle and allowed for a more informal discussion and presentations; others have asked the presenters their preferences, etc.

Additionally, some presenters will cancel their presentation at the last minute, miss a flight, or have another event that prevents them from attending the conference. You will be asked to think on your feet as you handle these types of challenges!

Kindly help us keep a record of attendance by locating the log in the back of the room and noting the approximate number of people, in addition to presenters, in the session.

Finally, we ask that you do everything you can to keep your session on time, as rooms are scheduled back-to-back. When you conclude your session, please be certain to thank the presenters for their work!

Special Instructions for Poster Presenters

Poster presenters should arrive a few minutes early to find your assigned table and set up for the session. Each poster presenter has been assigned a presentation board number (see listing in schedule for posters on Friday evening) and will have a table tent at your assigned location for the presentation.
